Dr. Shapiro is currently an Associate Professor of Medicine and Radiology at Oregon Health & Science University where he is on faculty in the Knight Cardiovascular Institute. After completing a cardiology fellowship, Michael spent two additional years in a clinical and research fellowship focused on advanced cardiovascular imaging at Massachusetts General Hospital. At OHSU, he's been able to combine his interests in atherosclerosis imaging and prevention of cardiovascular disease. He is Director of the Cardiac MR CT Program, Director of Atherosclerosis imaging, and Associate Director of the Center for Preventive Cardiology. His clinical practice is dedicated to the evaluation and management of patients with or at risk for atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease, with a specific focus on Familial Hypercholesterolemia.

Michael has published extensively in the areas of atherosclerosis imaging, lipid disorders, and preventive cardiology. Additionally, he is engaged in clinical trials testing novel lipid modulating therapeutics. His current investigative research focuses on PCSK9 physiology and its impact on lipoprotein metabolism. Michael is a member of numerous boards and national committees and is frequently invited to speak at national and international meetings on topics related to the prevention of cardiovascular disease.
